Johnson Succession

First Gifts

I don't recall whether it was one of my father's sermons or something we had talked about in Confirmation Class, but I was wondering about things as I looked out my bedroom window on a rainy day when I was about 15 years old. I was holding a box of church envelopes in one hand, and my first pay envelope from the local daycare in the other. I was trying to decide what to do with \$15 for two weekends of work moving furniture and toys.

I'm glad I chose, that day, to set aside 10% of my pay as an offering to the church. The amount was based on the Old Testament tithe; easy to calculate.

But it was never a legalistic approach to giving.

It was a discipline that I undertook. As a teen I could picture the other things I could do with \$1.50 from each envelope. Even so, I decided to let go of it, because I knew it belonged to God.

I am ever grateful that I exercised such faith in my youth, and have sought to maintain this approach to offerings ever since. Even as mortgages, a new deck, and car repairs require my attention, and as you wrestle with a variety of debts.

Several factors come into play as we each decide the size of our annual offering to the church. The value of our giving to recipients is one consideration. Another might be the liberating and transformative effect that giving has on the giver.

Update from the Treasurer

Typically, I only share financial news at the annual meeting, however I feel it is important to highlight a challenge that I believe we can overcome prior to vear-end.

As of September 30 our current receipts are \$47,500 versus our budget of \$61,500. The real challenge is the difference from this time last year, when our receipts were \$59,000 (after adjustment for a one-time special gift).

Even though we budget for a deficit, it is still important to meet our giving goals if we want to ensure that all our ministry objectives are properly funded.

There have not been any dramatic changes in our congregation's demographics further confounding the search for an answer.

My ask of you is to review your giving from last year to this year and if there is a gap, please do what you can to close that gap prior to December 31.
